Tasmanian Road Racing Championships

Symmons Plains – 9th October 2022

With all the rain and bad weather going round at the time it was very nice to have one of the best days for racing for a long time.

On Saturday it was very windy with a strong tail wind on the top straight. I lost count of the number of riders who overshot the hair pin during practice.











What should have been a very stressful final round of the championships was a remarkably casual day of exciting racing.



Some riders only had to finish to secure their titles and maybe that showed in the atmosphere and the social way riders went about their racing. But you can't take the racer out of some of them. Even though Jason Spencer was one of them who could cruse round and just finish, he provided a real highlight of the day with his big passing move on Scott Honeychurch in the third race. Through the sweeper he was nowhere and just sent it past Scott under brakes and parked in the apex to block a retake and then just continued. Team manager Greg Davies comment to me afterward was "Well at least I know the new brakes work well!"

An outstanding performance in the Superbike class came from Jeremy Huddlestone who has just returned from a meeting at Phillip Island. Normally he would be in, and often leading, the second group of riders but this time he was finishing on the tail of the leaders and clinched the "B" grade title.

In the Supersport class Mitch Hawksley didn't show his usual domination of the class and in fact dropped the bike in race 2 while leading, doing too much damage to continue. After a disastrous start to the year with a crash and engine troubles leaving Lachie Curtis with almost no points after two rounds, he decided to drag out the Suzuki GSX-R600 for round three and just have some fun and try to regain confidence. Boy did it work as this round he was the star of the class with a 3rd a 2nd and 2 Firsts.

Also having a disastrous start to the year Jason Wyllie decided to use the meeting to set up a Yamaha YZF-R6 600 for the 2-Hour and put in some very competitive laps. Meanwhile Chad Wyllie decided to park the 600 and concentrate on winning the Lites Production class.

In the GP section Taran Ocean managed to clinch the title from Josh van der Putten. In the third race Josh's bike went off song and he was looking like being a spectator for the final race until a nice gesture from Taran who offered his spare bike which Josh used to win the race.

Nice attitude was not confined to that class. Before the 600's went out for the final cut throat race Marcus Delaney, Jesse Woods and Lachie Curtis sat on the dummy grid talking, then when they were released it was fist pumps all round before battle began.

Although the field for the juniors was a little light on, those that we have got, have shown vast improvements for the year to show the value of the class and I believe we may have more riders for next year.



Class winner was Isaac Simmons but the big improvers this year have been David Coward and Gus O'Halloran. Gus still has many years to go in the class and now he is on a bike suited to his size, I would expect him to develop into quite a formidable rider before he gets to ride with the seniors. He still has to sort out the new European PMU 80 with overheating the problem this time.



Eleanor Renton is still trying to get on top of the problems with her bike so on Saturday Trevor took over the bike while Eleanor rode the new bike Trevor is setting up for next year. I think Trevor found the problem to be fuel starvation caused by problems with the fuel tap.



Another to play on the family bike was Martin Long who has spent the last few meetings on Matthew's bike while he doing his Uni studies. As Matthew told him if he can do well at Uni he can get a job where he makes enough money to be able to afford his own bike. Good call!

A heap of riders used it to practice acceleration into strong head winds.......... OOPS! is that the front wheel in the air?


















The other family group was three generations of Simmonds in Brett, Eric and Isaac, who was there to win the junior title.

Jason Spencer turned up with his wife and daughter to help with the presentation photos. Thank you Tamica for helping take them.



Bert Howe Story

For those of you following along at home you may remember last issue I mentioned that I thought there might be some connection to the Simmons in the Howe and Simmons electrical and Jack Simmons who was for a long time, along with his wife Marion the timekeepers at Symmons Plains for the bikes. That is after Bert and Audrey Howe.

I was told that Terry Brooks knew Jack very well, so I caught up with Terry at a recent bike show at the Motor Museum. He thought there may be a connection, and he thought Jack was an electrician and had a feeling his father may have been involved with bikes a little.

This tale shows how important the Library can be in research. First though was to try to find at least a first initial for the father. Trove was the start and after a few tries where I tried around the year of the Mrs. Howe photo of her Chalmers Church Choir, and I came up with a "P" Simmons who was the choir master at the Invermay Methodist Church who looked promising.

For those of you who don't know what TROVE is, it is the National Library web site that has most Australian newspapers digitized up to 1954 (copyright laws preclude after that year). You just list the papers and the date range you are looking for and put the search name Simmons and it brings up all the articles that name appears in. Easy except it brings up every article including anyone with that surname including sports teams etc.

Next step was to head to the library armed with this very limited info. On telling my main man that we knew they were Gallipoli veterans he went to the war records, and I decided to try the land register that names every occupier of land in Launceston and the next column has who owns the land the building is on. Bingo the H & S Electrical shop land was owned by Herbert George Howe and George Percy Simmons and the war records show a GP Simmons, veteran, who was born in the 1890's who listed his occupation as an electrician.

We now know his birth date so we then head to Carr Villa records to see if I could match that name to a plot there and that gave a death date. That means I could then go to the family notices in the Examiner that usually listed the family members. That listed a few lady siblings and the last was a John but with the continual name changing still in the frame as at that time some "Johns" changed to being Jack. Into the electoral role, and I knew they lived in Albion St. Invermay, and in the late 1940's Percy Simmons, an electrician, was listed with his wife and one other, John a salesman at that address but the 1950 roll had him leave the nest.

A hunch, try Trove around this time to see if John may have got married to Marion. I found an engagement notice for a John Grant Simmons getting engaged to a Marion Helen Thompson placed by her mother and deceased father. OK go back a few years and look for his death notice. Only a few months before, he died and among the family listed was Marion and her brother Donald. Don Thompson, bingo, better known to TMCC members as "Sandy" Thompson who had what the factory recognised as the fastest BSA Bantam in the world timed on Bakers Beach.

Another confirmation that John Grant Simmons is the son of the co-founder of H & S Electrical is that in our committee listings at the correct time we had a J.G. Simmons join the committee and go on to be the club timekeeper for many decades.

I would say that this photo of Jack and Marion Simmons, a long time club member, is the son of Percy Simmons from H & S Electrical. That says to me that the club's timekeeping was in the hands of Howe and Simmons from around 1930 to the mid 1980's.

Numbers – Background, Colour and Size

If you intend racing in 2023, your numbers and background MUST comply with the GCRs to pass scrutineering. You have been given ample notice to get it right! You will not be allowed to race until your bike complies.


Below are the background and number colours for "Modern" bikes in Section 7 of the 2022 MoMS. These colours and sizes apply to all bikes competing in Tasmania except for Log Booked Historic bikes. Log Booked Historic bikes must conform to the colours and sizes as listed in Section 8 of the 2022 MoMS.

7.11.3.2 Figures must be clearly legible, the minimum being:

DIMENSION	MEASUREMENT (mm)
Height	140
Width of each figure	75
Space between 2 figures	25
Space between figures and edge of number panel	12

- 7.11.3.3 Unless otherwise specified in SRs, number plates for Juniors must be as follows:
 - a) A minimum plate size of 225mm width and 200mm height,
 - b) Figures with minimum sizes of 100mm height and 20mm width of stroke.

7.11.2 Number Plate Colours

7.11.2.1 Number plate colours for Senior and Junior Competition must be as follows:

7.11.2.2 Additional colour combinations may be used, at the discretion of the RCB.

7.11.2.3 Australian Superbikes may use any contrasting colour on side number plates providing they are legible at 20 metres.

7.11.3 Number Plate Figures

7.11.3.1 Unless otherwise specified in SRs, Road Race discipline Senior number figures must be Arial Rounded MT Bold font the serif on number '1' must be removed.
